Suffield Police Department is currently accepting applications for current Connecticut P.O.S.T.C. Certified Police Officers for the position of Police Officer. Applicants must be either active Connecticut P.O.S.T.C certified police officers in good standing with their current department, or have retired in good standing, still having Connecticut P.O.S.T.C Police Officer certification status.

GENERAL DUTIES

The Town of Suffield seeks qualified applicants for the position of Certified Police Officer. This is a full time (40 hour per week), hourly position in the Police Department. Some of the duties include but are not limited to: patrolling an assigned area on foot or in a motor vehicle to enforce laws and to prevent, detect and investigate complaints, motor vehicle violations and crimes. He or she makes arrests, interviews suspects and witnesses, takes written statements, prepares written reports, assists other town agencies, administers CPR and/or first aid, directs traffic, as well as testifies in court. SALARY/BENEFITS

Starting Salary: \$55,120 to \$63,003 (Collective bargaining agreement is currently being negotiated)

MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

- Education: Applicants must be a high school graduate or possess a GED.
- License: Applicants must possess and maintain a valid driver's license.
- Residency: Applicants must be U.S. citizens and reside within a twenty five (25) mile radius of the Police Department within one (1) year after completion of the department's field training program.
- Physical Examination: Applicants must meet department physical fitness standards at the 40th percentile level certified through CHIP, Inc. **MUST SUBMIT A VALID C.H.I.P CARD AT THE TIME OF APPLICATION.**

- Drug Testing: Applicants shall be required to submit to a drug test as part of the pre employment medical examination.
- Character Requirements and other factors: Applicants must meet the highest legal and ethical standards. Honesty and integrity are paramount to the profession. Candidates will undergo a rigorous background investigation, including a polygraph, before any offer of employment. An applicant may be disqualified for poor employment history, recent use of illegal drugs, or previously undetected criminal activity.

TESTING REQUIREMENTS

The selection process will include, at a minimum, a detailed review of your application packet, and the successful completion of the Department's selection process which includes but may not be limited to the following:

- Written examination (Passing 70%)
- Physical agility testing (C.H.I.P. at 40%, see www.chip-inc.com)
- Oral examination (Passing 70%)
- Polygraph examination
- Psychological evaluation
- Detailed background investigation
- Medical examination
- Chief's interview
- Police Commission Interview
