MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE ADVISORY COMMISSION ON CAPITAL EXPENDITURES FEBRUARY 17, 2022 7:00 P.M. HYBRID MEETING

Chairman Stevens called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Public Participation

None

Approval of Minutes from the February 10, 2022 Regular Meeting

Chairman Stevens noted that he had read the minutes and felt they were accurate as presented.

N. Greco asked that a correction be made to the spelling of her last name.

E. Basile motioned and N. Greco seconded to approve the Minutes from the February 10, 2022 Regular Meeting as amended. Motion passed unanimously.

Presentation from Highway/Public Works – Mark Cervione and Chris Matejek

Chairman Stevens invited **Highway Foreman Mark Cervione** and **Facilities Manager Chris Matejek** to present to the commission. They provided the following overview in priority order:

Total Request of \$2,657,000

- 6 Wheel truck lease payment 4 of 5 \$20,000
 - Non-negotiable item
- Landfill Backhoes lease payment 3 of 5 \$20,000
 - o Non-negotiable item
- Paving Maintenance Highway Garage \$260,000
 - Two-part request
 - Paving of Highway Garage Parking Lot \$160,000
 - Pavement Management- \$100,000
 - Town Engineer and Highway Department both have Pavement Management Funds Project work is funded through Town Engineer and "on the fly" fixes such as pothole patching, drainage and erosion are handled by Highway Department
- Roadside mower extension arm \$55,000
 - 88 miles of Roadside mowing- done twice a year
 - New extension arm is needed for our current mower as the current arm is broken
 - This item was pushed off from last year's requests
- Suffield Middle School tennis/basketball court replacement \$200,000

- Tennis courts are 22 years old estimated life span is 20 years
- \$400,000 was requested and received last year
- Town has entered into an agreement with an architect to engineer a design leaving approximately \$375,000
- Project estimates were received in February 2021
- \$580,000 is the updated estimate to complete the project
 - Scope of project has crept up
 - The dollar is also not going as far as it did a year ago
 - COVID has made everything extremely challenging
- The courts have become a safety issue
- Additional funds are being requested to complete the entire project appropriately
- Switch/Go truck re-designation wing mower/mower \$15,000 transfer
 - Re-designation of funds from last year
 - Switch/Go Truck is no longer needed
- 2 Fifty (50) yard dumpsters for the landfill \$32,000
 - Life expectancy of dumpsters is 7 years Town of Suffield has gotten 15 years out of the dumpsters
- Landfill Scale \$40,000
 - \circ This item can be held off for now
- Landfill Compactor \$25,000
 - Cardboard compactor needs replacement
- Roofing slush fund \$150,000
 - High School Roof although other school roofs may be applicable as well
- Highway Garage improvements (siding and doors) \$50,000
 - Siding, insulation, doors
 - Building is sufficient simply needs to be updated in certain areas
 - Could package these improvement with parking lot paving
- Storage Building Highway \$100,000
 - Important to the improvement of the Highway Garage location
 - Storage locations are extremely limited at this time
 - Immediate need
 - 3,000 to 5,000 square foot building needed
- Brick cleaning and re-pointing Suffield High School \$40,000
 - Not an urgent request
 - Some areas of High School are in rough shape
- Veterans Park Funding \$250,000
 - o Expansion of monument to include additional wars
 - Funding sources are still to be determined
 - Project is in early stages request amount could be cut in half if necessary

• Suffield High School turf field – \$700,000

- Life expectancy has been exceeded at this point
- Compaction tests to be conducted to determine if the turf is a safety issue for students
- Project can probably be put off for one more year at most
- Consider whether this could this be split over two capital years
- Cost may be closer to \$750,000
- Suffield High School Shingled Roofing \$700,000

Discussion

Mr. Cervione and **Mr. Matejek** provided their thoughts on what items are considered to be "must haves" and a discussion ensued on how things will be presented. It was agreed that the Highway Garage Maintenance and Paving Management will be combined.
